Council Meeting Monday 16 March at 7pm

The public forum has been cancelled but the Council meeting will proceed.

Here is an extract from an email we have received from Council

- alternatives to road closure in Greenwich on New Year's Eve. We hope that Council will undertake some community consultation before plans are finalised for the end of the year.
- appointment of Greenwich Village Games Committee – **keep the dates free 4 – 6 December**
- Council's proposed rejection of a developer proposal to re-zone the Telstra site at 524-542 Pacific Highway for commercial/residential use.

This is one of the sites that the DPIE has identified as a Significant Site in its 2036 Plan for St Leonards and Crows Nest – we discussed this in our letter to the Minister for Planning attached to

Given that the site is already wedged between two huge residential developments – the 44 storey Landmark development and the 26 and 47 residential towers (plus a 15 storey commercial building) under construction opposite St Leonards Station – we have suggested that the Telstra site is well suited to take on some of the residential development proposed for SLS (albeit at a significantly reduced scale to leave some blue sky for those behind it).

The developer has foreshadowed Council's rejection of its proposal and has already applied for the decision to be reviewed by the Sydney North Planning Panel

- redevelopment of Lane Cove Golf Course as a Recreation Precinct with a nine (9) hole golf course; driving range; putt-putt golf; 5 indoor multi-sport courts; 4 outdoor multi-courts/ tennis courts; gym; golf professional shop; stage; reception; restaurant with extensive terrace; and a 300-space underground car park.

It is proposed to put the concept and proposed design out for consultation for 6 weeks

- a somewhat complicated proposal for dog access to Kingsford Smith Oval following lively discussion at the last Council meeting about Council's consultation processes

- and no mention of SLS! What is going on?
